KS1 End of Day Timings Consultation

We are proposing to change the end of school day timing for Years 1 and 2 to 3.25pm (currently 3.20pm). This will extend the school day slightly for these pupils and also shorten the wait for parents/carers who are collecting children from KS2.

Class Dojo Communication

We are making a slight change to our communication through Class Dojo. Teachers will continue to send information about homework, photos of work in class, school visits, experiences etc plus messages and reminders through Class Dojo. We know that parents/carers find this really useful and that you enjoy seeing photos of activities in school.

In terms of parents/carers contacting teachers however, we would now like you to use the following instead of Class Dojo:

- Email the teacher using info@oustonprimary.org.uk. Please add into the subject box 'FAO Mr/Mrs/Miss...' so the office can direct this to the relevant teacher. The teacher can then either send an email reply or will contact you by telephone.
- Phone the school office or pop in to ask for a message to be passed on to the Class Teacher or to request a meeting or phone call.
- For more urgent issues, contact the school office and ask to speak to me or Mrs Wise
- Continue to inform us about absences, appointments etc through telephoning the school office.

The reason for this is that we are finding teachers are reading and answering more and more messages (often quite lengthy) out of school hours; this can encroach on their planning and marking time in addition to time with their own families and does not allow them to switch off from work. They also do not always see important messages sent later in the evening (about the next day) which can cause issues and confusion.

Teachers will from time to time send messages directly to individual parents/carers – for example if organising after school activities/sports events etc and you can of course reply to these as needed.

This will start from tomorrow and we appreciate your support with this.

Party Invitations

Could we please ask that unless the whole class are invited, party invitations are not sent into school to be given out by the class teacher: messaging parents/carers direct about party invites or giving these out on the yard before or after school would be much appreciated.



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Grapes at Lunchtime

Another reminder that whole grapes must not be sent into school in packed lunches for pupils. They must be at least cut in half. Whole grapes are a choking hazard for primary school age children, particularly in a busy lunch hall when they are chatting and laughing with friends whilst eating. Thank you for your support with this.
