Ouston Primary School: Sports Premium Plan 2024-25

The Sport Premium is an amount of money, which the government has agreed to allocate schools for this academic year (2024-25). The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision and increase the participation in PE and sport.

At Ouston Primary School we strive to promote healthy, active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all. The premium will therefore be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision on PE, School Scport and Physical Activity and to encourage the development of a healthy, active lifestyle.

The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. We endeavour to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

Key indicator 1: increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

Key indicator 2: the engagement of **all** pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school. (Children with SEND should take part in 20 minutes of daily activity)

Key Indicator 3: the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

Key indicator 4: broader experience of a **range of sports and activities** offered to all pupils

Key indicator 5: increased participation in competitive sport

NB School swimming is funded separately and we use this for Year 4 to go swimming weekly from September to July. In the last half term, priority is given to Year 4s who are still unable to swim 25m competently and to Year 6s who are not yet able to do this.
