Promoting British Values at Ouston Primary School

The DfE ask schools 'to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.'

At Ouston Primary these values are reinforced regularly and in the following ways:

Democracy

OPS holds the Rights Respecting Schools Silver Award. As such two pupils from each class are ambassadors promoting the principles of the RRSA forming a focus group. Each year the children decide upon their class charter and the rights associated with these. All the children contribute to the drawing up of the charter. Children have many opportunities for their voices to be heard. We have a school council which meets regularly to discuss various emerging issues and give their points of view. Two members for each class are voted in by their class. We hold weekly Rights Respecting Schools Assemblies which explore different aspects of the Rights of the Child.

The Rule of Law

The importance of Laws, whether they be those that govern the class, the school, or the country, are consistently reinforced throughout regular school days, as well as when dealing with behaviour and through school assemblies. Pupils are taught the value and reasons behind laws, that they govern and protect us, the responsibilities that this involves and the consequences when laws are broken. Visits from authorities such as the Police and Fire Service help reinforce this message.

Individual Liberty

Within school, pupils are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment. As a school we educate and provide boundaries for young pupils to make choices safely, through provision of a safe environment and empowering education. Pupils are encouraged to know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms and advised how to exercise these safely, for example through our Online Safety and RSE/PSHE lessons or during Forest School and other outdoor adventure activities. Whether it be through choice of a learning challenge, participation in our numerous extra-curricular clubs and opportunities or daily school meal choices, pupils are given the freedom to make choices with support with this as needed.

Mutual Respect

As a Rights Respecting School, mutual respect is at the heart of our values. We teach respect for children's rights. Children learn that their behaviour can have an effect on their own rights and those of others. All members of the school community treat each other with respect. We support many charities throughout the year and take part in national events, such as Children in Need. We have 'Friday Fundraisers' where pupils organise their own event to support a charity of their choice.

Tolerance of those of Different Faiths and Beliefs

OPS is situated in an area which is not greatly culturally diverse, therefore we place a great emphasis on the understanding of diversity with our children. Our annual One Britain Week teaches children about equality and diversity in Britain. During this week our pupils participate in the Show Racism the Red Card campaign and explore themes linked to a variety of faiths and communities. Assemblies are also regularly planned to address this issue either directly or through the inclusion of stories and celebrations from a variety of faiths and cultures. Our RE, PSHE and RRSA teaching reinforce this. Members of different faiths or religions are encouraged to share their knowledge to enhance learning within classes and the school. Children visit places of worship that are important to different faiths.

Below are a range of events and activities that help us to promote these values throughout the school year:-

Article 12 You have the right to give your opinion, and for adults to listen and take it seriously

Article 17 You have the right to get information that is important to your well-being

Article 29 Your education should help you use and develop your talents and abilities. It should also help you learn to live peacefully, protect the environment and respect other people.

Article 30 You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion

Article 31 You have the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities

Article 42 You have the right to know your rights! Adults should know about these rights and help you learn about them, too


Events
